Who Should Complete this Application?

This application is for domestic freshman and transfer students. International students and students applying to College Credit Plus, eLearning programs (OHIO Online), graduate programs, regional campus programs or as non-degree students should not complete this application. Please see ohio.edu/apply for application instructions and to apply.

Application Instructions

Step 1:

Students must complete the application for admission and scholarships form and submit a \$50 nonrefundable application fee. Checks or money orders should be made out to Ohio University. Students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch in high school qualify for an application fee waiver. These can be obtained by having the high school counselor contact Undergraduate Admissions. Students may also access the application form and pay the application fee online at ohio.edu/admissions/apply.

Step 2:

Applicants who are currently in high school, have been out of high school for less than one year, or are transfer students with fewer than 20 semester hours or 30 quarter hours of college work must request high school transcripts be sent to Undergraduate Admissions directly from the high school. Transfer applicants and freshman applicants who have taken college coursework must request official copies of transcripts from **all** attended post-secondary institutions be sent directly to Undergraduate Admissions.

Step 3:

Applicants who wish to provide standardized test results, either SAT or ACT, may have scores sent to Undergraduate Admissions. Undergraduate Admissions prefers that test results be sent directly from the testing agencies. OHIO's ACT code is 3314, and the SAT code is 1593. Applicants who do not wish to provide standardized test results may apply as a test-optional applicant by noting so in the application below.

Step 4:

Applicants may choose to submit additional application materials with the application form. Optional application materials could include essays; teacher or counselor recommendations; lists of extra-curricular activities or employment; and/or descriptions of honors, awards and achievements. The applicant's full name should be clearly displayed on any supplemental documentation.

Additional Requirements

An essay is not required for general admission to OHIO, though applicants may choose to submit an essay to supplement their application. Honors Tutorial College applicants are required to submit two essay responses. College of Business and School of Journalism applicants are encouraged, though not required, to submit one essay response. If an applicant chooses to submit an optional essay, potential topics could include describing any academic challenges the applicant has faced, the applicant's academic and career objectives or the applicant's involvement in community affairs. Recommended length is 250-500 words.

Students admitted to Ohio University will be asked to verify criminal and school discipline history during the enrollment confirmation period.

Test Optional Pathway

OHIO does not require students to submit ACT or SAT test scores for undergraduate admission or merit scholarship consideration. If you choose to submit standardized test scores, they must be submitted directly from the testing agency. (SAT school code: 1593; ACT school code: 3314)

Note: OHIO considers the Evidenced-based Reading and Writing scores from the SAT.

Students should indicate whether or not they plan to apply test-optional in the application below.

Honors and Scholars Opportunities

Students interested in pursuing an Honors Tutorial College major should select the appropriate college and major code on the application form.

All applicants are considered automatically for all other honors and scholars opportunities. Honors and scholars opportunities at OHIO include the OHIO Honors Program (OHP), 1804 Scholars and OHP-designated honors and scholars programs specific to your academic college/major or other criteria. Please note that eligible selected students may be asked to complete a

separate supplemental application after they have applied to the University. Most successful candidates submit: (1) a list of extra-curricular activities or employment, (2) one essay (either a Common Application essay prompt, OHIO's essay prompt or the essays for the Honors Tutorial College), and (3) at least one letter of recommendation.

Please note that entering in summer prevents freshmen from fully participating in Bobcat Student Orientation, disqualifies them from consideration for most scholarships and may affect the financial aid award offer.

6. HTC consolidates business interests into one Business Administration major leading to a Bachelor of Business Administration upon graduation. Students in the program may pursue any business track of interest, including multiple, though they will still have one major.
7. HTC consolidates chemistry interests into one Chemistry major leading to a Bachelor of Science upon graduation. Students in the program may pursue any chemistry track of interest, including multiple, though they will still have one major.
8. Honors Tutorial College (HTC) applicants are required to submit two essays and are encouraged to submit a list of extra-curricular activities/employment and at least one letter of recommendation. Additionally, some HTC majors encourage applicants to submit other additional materials. Details can be found at ohio.edu/honors/tutorial-college/apply. Students selected to move forward in the application process will be invited to interview. While your HTC application is pending, your application automatically will be reviewed for admission to the appropriate non-HTC college. You are encouraged to complete all admission requirements and pursue all scholarship opportunities for your non-HTC college while your HTC application is pending.
9. Applicants to the College of Business are encouraged, though not required, to submit an essay detailing their preparation for study in OHIO's College of Business.
10. Applicants to the E.W. Scripps School of Journalism are encouraged, though not required, to submit an essay detailing how you want to help shape the future of journalism.
